HOLIDAY GIVING IS APPROACHING & REACH NEEDS YOUR HELP

Helping our vulnerable neighbors during the Winter holidays has been part of Reach's DNA for many years. As a member of Montgomery County's Holiday Giving Coalition, and with generous donations from partners, in 2019 Reach provided more than 250 Thanksgiving dinner baskets. For December, we distributed toys, gift cards, and dinner baskets to almost 200 families. For a full

The number of Rockville and Montgomery County families requesting help this year is expected to be much higher than in previous years. At the same time supporters may find it much more challenging to donate as they did in 2019. Many groups collect

Reach is invested in serving at least as many families this year, and we recognize that doing so will take ingenuity and creativity, as well as the dedication of our partners. We are

Some may remember meeting Carmen at the MKHC 10th anniversary celebration last Fall when she partnered with the community and community clinics in her

position with Adventist HealthCare. Carmen was well-known to many of the MKHC staff due to that relationship and getting to work with her fulltime for the benefit of MKHC patients is a wonderful opportunity. Carmen has a business adminstration degree and experience, has also volunteered extensively, and is fluent in both Spanish and English. Her work with the Stanford Diabetes Self-Management Program will be especially useful when MKHC opens the planned Diabetes Clinic.

CITIZENSHIP FEE & LANGUAGE OUTREACH PROGRAM

Reach's Language Outreach Program (LOP) offers a Citizenship Test Preparedness class every winter and summer. The class in intense, with students committing to attend classes 36 hours of evening classes over six weeks. This summer 15 students completed this intensive class (via virtual technology). Additionally, LOP Director Cecilia Rojas helps both students and other community members complete the complex Citizenship application, spending many hours with applicants.

Last year, the U.S. Citizenship and Application Service announced its intent to increase the fees for many immigration services, one of which was

- **U.S. Citizenship application fee**. The service was required to ask for public feedback and consider that information before a final determination was made. Then COVID-19 closures began and all in-person interviews and visits to U.S.C.I.S. were halted. Now, however, the increased fees are taking effect
- . All U.S. Citizenship applications postmarked after October 2nd (this Friday) will require a payment of the new fee **increased from \$640 to \$1170**. Substantial increases are also taking place for other fees. The application fee for suspension of deportation is increasing by 535%. Fee waiver for most low-income applicants is also being eliminated. Here is the <u>link</u> to the final rule and fee schedule.



Now for some good LOP news: 1. As virtual experiences have become so prevalent, LOP determined it was time to add a computer course to its offerings. This summer, one of the Conversation classes focused on skills using phones, tablets, laptops and desktops for email, Zoom meetings, learning online, and more. 2. 150 potential ESL students took virtual placement tests for fall classes and these tests included both verbal responses in real time as well as written responses that were emailed. 3. LOP is offering both a standard semester of classes as well as a condensed semester with more classes per week over 10 weeks. 4. Child Tutors are assisting 40 children with learning through online connection. Some of the creative ideas and tools that are being used to continue learning through the pandemic are expected to be used even when we return to in person teaching. This will provide even better learning experiences for our students and mean the program can reach even more members of our community for whom learning English can be life changing.

HOW TO VOTE IN MD IN THE GENERAL ELECTION

On Tuesday, November 3rd, U.S. Citizens age 18 and older will have the opportunity to vote. Cast a ballot for U.S. President, Congress, county & local positions, and choose responses to questions at the state and county level. COVID concerns have changed some of the usual voting procedures. Here is some information for residents of Montgomery County who choose to vote (and Reach strongly requests that all who have this right and privilege do so):

- Register to vote (by Oct. 13), update voter information or confirm you are a registered voter here.
- Residents can vote at any polling location on November 3rd, not just at the polling location for their address.
- There will be many fewer places to vote on November 3rd than usual.
- Residents can vote early (between Oct. 26 and Nov. 2) at 11 locations throughout the county.
- For a complete list of all early voting locations and Election Day polling places, see <u>Montgomery County Elections</u>.
- All residents can request and receive a Mail in Ballot - but they must request the ballot by returning a copy of the request received in the mail in early September or by requesting one no later than October 20 here.
- Mail-in ballots may be returned by US Mail or at Ballot Drop-off boxes. Here is the list of Drop-off box <u>locations</u>.

- Get nonpartisan information about the General election ballot, candidates, and questions from the League of Women Voters <u>here</u>.

COMBINED FEDERAL CAMPAIGN NOW OPEN FOR 2021

Federal employees can give to many of their favorite charities with a one-time or recurring donation through the Combined Federal Campaign (CFC). Each autumn, many federal departments hold rallies, contests, tabling events, and more to let their staffers know about the CFC. Managed by the United Way, the CFC offers federal staff a simple way to make donations directly from their paycheck.

Community Reach of Montgomery County participates in the CFC. Our CFC code is 34303. 

STAY CONNECTED - LOOK FOR OPPORTUNITIES TO ASSIST WITH COVID TESTING ON SATURDAYS THROUGH DECEMBER - more information will be posted on Reach social media, Reach website, and the Montgomery County Volunteer Center in the next few weeks.

CLIENT INTAKE COORDINATORS for Rockville Emergency Assistance Program (REAP). Are you a compassionate, detail-oriented person with a desire to help those in need? Work a four-hour shift weekly during business hours (ideally from 9am-1pm or 1pm-5pm) to help us assist Rockville residents facing eviction; provide County residents with referrals for low-cost dental, vision and other services; and much more.
