#### Dear Friends:

In early March, Paul asked us to start thinking of what we should do if we were not able to hold our annual Gala. Agnes said we could hold a "Virtual Gala." Andrea, our Director of Development, asked, "What is a Virtual Gala?" And so this year's adventure began.

There were many critical issues Reach had to face in the last two-plus months. We had to determine how to continue to see patients at Mansfield Kaseman Health Clinic while preventing COVID from entering as well. We needed to find a way to teach our Language Outreach Program students when we could not have a class together in one geographic location. We needed to be especially careful with our Senior Reach clients while staying in even closer contact as they self-isolated. The residents at our permanent supportive houses needed to be protected and also continue to receive case management. The Reach Board and staff know that none of these accomplishments would have happened without the generous volunteer and financial support you have provided. We cannot continue to provide these life changing services for the most vulnerable without your continued support.





#### **AUCTION RULES & PROCEDURES**

#### RULES

- 1. All bids are final. Before making a bid, please note any restrictions and specifications carefully. Unless otherwise specified, dates and times of services or the use of facilities are to be arranged mutually by the donor and buyer.
- 2. Unless otherwise specified, the use of auction items involving services or facilities must be completed by May 30, 2021.
- 3. All auction items are sold "as is."
- 4. Values indicated for auction items are good faith estimates of the value of the items furnished. We are required to provide these by the Internal Revenue Service. Any amount paid for the goods or services in excess of this estimate may be considered a charitable contribution. Where it is not possible to establish an independent value for one-of-a-kind items, the purchase price will be presumed to be the fair market value. Consult your own tax advisor as to the charitable deduction that may be allowed for any item you purchase. Community Reach of Montgomery County is recognized as a Section 501(c)(3) organization by the Internal Revenue Service.
- 5. All sales are final. Arrangements for services must be negotiated between the purchaser and the donor.
- 6. Payment may be made by Mastercard, Visa, American Express, Discover, or personal check. Item won will be mailed or delivered to the winner upon full payment. Payment can be made online at www.CMRocks.org. Use the "Donate" button and add note for Auction payment, or use the link in the email sent after the Gala. Please make sure to include the address for item delivery, or email address to AndreaKWink@CMRocks.org. If paying by check, please add a note in the mailed envelop with address for item delivery. Please make payment no later than June 5, 2020. Contact Reach at 301-637-0730 with questions.
- 7. The buyer waives any claims for liability against either Reach or the donor of the property or service. Neither Reach nor the donor is responsible for any personal injuries or damages to property that may result from the use of the property or service sold, and make no representations regarding the quality, safety, condition or any other characteristics of the property or services.

- 8. The auction committee reserves the right to combine and categorize all donated items.
- 9. The amount bid is the final amount unless Maryland State Sales Tax applies to any portion of the purchase. If so, sales tax will be calculated and added to the final accepted bid to receive the total purchase price.

#### **PROCEDURES**

- 1. To bid, a bidder uses the "chat" feature of the webinar platform.
  - a. Make sure to use "Panelists and Attendees" so everyone can see a bid.
  - b. Add your bid amount followed by your first initial and last name. Example, for John Smith to bid \$150, pull up "chat," make sure the words after your screen name says "Panelists and Attendees," type "150 J Smith." Quickly click the "enter" key and look at the chat line to confirm your bid was sent.
- 2. Bids must be made promptly.
- 3. All bidders must be recognized by the auctioneer.
- 4. The auctioneer will acknowledge the highest bidder as the purchaser by repeating the final bid and the bidder's name. Bidder confirms information by using the "chat" feature to "Panelists and Attendees" to type final purchase price and full name of winning bidder including address for delivery of item.
- 5. If the auctioneer determines a bid is inadequate for the value of the article offered, he may reject the bid and withdraw the article from sale.
- 6. In the event of a dispute, the auctioneer will make the final decision.
- 7. Item will be delivered to winner by mail or in person within 3 business days of full payment unless other mutually agreeable arrangements are made between Reach and winner.

### ROCKVILLE EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (REAP) Established 1981

Rockville Emergency Assistance Program (REAP) was the first direct service provided by Reach. Its purpose is to protect our Rockville residents who are the working poor from the crisis of eviction and utility shut-off when an unexpected financial emergency occurs. REAP also provides financial assistance for prescriptions and medical procedures. Additionally, REAP offers referrals for any eligible Montgomery County resident to partner organizations that provide food, clothing, dental care and vision care. Clients are given information about other services that are available.

For those living paycheck-to-paycheck, illness, car repair, and similar unplanned events can mean the difference between being able to pay rent and having to move in with friends or family, or into a shelter.

The COVID-19 emergency has created a much more dire situation for those residents who live on the financial edge as well as many families who felt they were relatively financially safe. In just a few weeks, the unemployment rate has sky rocketed. It is expected many businesses will not survive this shutdown. The economic impact is expected to be long-term and many Montgomery County residents will need financial assistance to pay mortgages, rent, utilities, purchase food and so much more. Currently, REAP is serving clients virtually except when it is required that original documents are provided. Appointments are carefully scheduled for those situations. Many are currently asking for assistance to purchase food, cleaning supplies, and similar items.

Evictions are on hold as are utility terminations. However, we fully expect when those orders are removed, many will need assistance to pay bills that are in arrears by many months. Residents will need assistance for a much longer period than can currently be covered by the terms of the government grants that make up the greatest part of REAP funds.

#### SENIOR REACH PROGRAM Established 1983 as Elderly Ministries

The Senior Reach program provides home care and home repair and modifications to lower income seniors living in the City of Rockville with the goal of helping them age in place. During FY19, Senior Reach served 89 seniors providing home care services, volunteer callers and visitors, monthly Manna Food deliveries, emergency life links and assistive devices, furnace inspections and repairs, home safety checks, and home repairs and modifications.





Due to the pandemic, many of the seniors who receive home care chose to take a break from those services since they did not want anyone in their homes during the Stay at Home recommendations and orders. To better serve our clients during this time, we have taken on additional volunteers and partnered with organizations who want opportunities to help seniors. They are calling our clients more frequently to make sure they feel less isolated, and they are picking up groceries and prescriptions on a weekly basis.



#### HOUSING PROGRAM Established 1987

Since 1987, the Housing Program of Reach has gone through a number of transformations. We began with the Chase Partnership Center, a shelter for single men experiencing homelessness, opened Jefferson House that is described below, started a hypothermia shelter for single women that transformed to a year-round program, joined our partners in the fight to end homelessness in the Hope Housing Program, and in 2014 purchased our first house and opened Rockland House.

The Jefferson House was established in 1991 to provide permanent supportive services to six men who have completed a drug and/or alcohol rehabilitation program. The Rockland House has room to provide a home for five women coming out of homelessness.





Residents at both houses are taking the pandemic very seriously – especially as many have health issues that may make catching COVID-19 a serious situation. Besides staying at home, washing their hands and distancing when out to get groceries, one resident made face masks for herself, residents, and Clinic staff. Experiencing homelessness at a time like this is even more stressful and dangerous than usual. Reach's housing residents are happy to be able to safely self-isolate.

The Housing Program of Reach provides our residents with case management, life skills, client support, and affordable housing.

#### LANGUAGE OUTREACH PROGRAM Established 1993

The Language Outreach Program (LOP) is a family based program that serves immigrants with classes in English as a Second Language as well as intense month-long Citizenship Test Preparedness classes. Additionally, Conversation classes are offered through Reach and in partnership with other organizations in Montgomery County.

In addition to providing classes for adults, free tutoring and childcare is provided for the children of students.

As schools closed, LOP quickly pivoted and within a couple of weeks, ESL classes were taking place virtually through Zoom, WhatsAp, and other platforms most easily accessed by students. Following online ESL classes, conversation classes also became virtual and other non-profits reached out to receive help for their clients. As Maryland cancelled school, first through April, then eventually until next year, LOP reached out to the children who had been served through the program, and then to other children who were in school at our partner locations and beyond.

Child care providers offered to work virtually with the children to help them complete school assignments. Staff is currently planning LOP's first Virtual Graduation ceremony to take place on Friday, June 26<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m.

### MANSFIELD KASEMAN HEALTH CLINIC (MKHC) Established 2009

The Mansfield Kaseman Health Clinic offers comprehensive primary care, specialty care, behavioral health services, pharmacy and lab services, health care education and social services to low-income uninsured adult residents of Montgomery County. Those insured by some of the Maryland Medicaid policies can choose practitioners at MKHC as their primary care provider.

MKHC also provides specialty services, primarily through pro bono practitioners. These specialties currently include Behavioral Health, Endocrinology, Gastroenterology, Gynecology, Internal Medicine, Podiatry and Pulmonology. Again, in FY19, MKHC met or exceeded HEDIS rates.

Many patients chose to cancel appointments or to avoid medical care during the start of the pandemic. Those with chronic diseases still needed to come to MKHC for check-ups and labs. Staff quickly ramped up the inventory and use of PPEs. They called patients to check on their health. Additionally, they began to research telehealth options. Currently, a quarter of MKHC appointments are being held virtually. Six practitioners are providing telehealth appointments. It is expected this type of appointment will become part of the new normal for some patients.
