Pat was the staff member who most frequently was approached for answers

For Reach and MKHC in general, Pat tracked all donations, wrote thank you letters, and generally made sure everyone had what they needed to

Pat preferred getting everything done without being noticed. FALL ESL & CONVERSATION CLASSES ABOUT TO BEGIN

This Fall, Reach Language Outreach Program classes will all be held online. English as a Second Language (ESL) class schedules will include a two-night per week session that will run from September 8th through December 17th, or a three-night per week

session running from September 14th through November 19th. Registration fees are \$20 with a \$30 book fee. Sliding scale fees are available for students who will be financially burdened by these costs.

sessions begin September 8th, September 21st, and October 27th. Conversation classes are free and do not require the purchase of books.

COMPLETE THE CENSUS & REGISTER TO VOTE

Take the 2020 U.S. Census: There is still time to complete the 2020 Census for your household, even though Census workers began contacting households that had

Census 2020 not yet completed the U.S. Census earlier this month. Specific household information cannot be shared with any government entity, business, individual, etc. for 72 years (beginning in 2092). All people who live in the U.S., regardless of their legal status, are counted. Census numbers determine the federal

dollars our community will receive for social services, government representatives, number of schools, etc. If you have not completed the Census, do so at: <u>2020</u> <u>Census</u>. Please share this information with your network.

Register to Vote/Request a Mail-in Ballot: This year's general election will take place on November 3rd. U.S. Citizens in Montgomery County will vote for U.S. President, U.S. Congressional Representatives, Montgomery County School Board,

Montgomery County Circuit Court Judges as well as questions to become state or county law. Due to COVID, any U.S. Citizen residing in Maryland may request a mail-in ballot and vote by mail, no reason needed. There will be early voting locations in every county, and polls will be open on November 3rd. To register to vote, check to see if you are registered to vote, request a mail-



in ballot, or get additional information about the election, see <u>State Board of Elections</u>. For those who choose to vote by mail and limit their exposure to others, the U.S. Postal Service recommends requesting a mail-in ballot at least 15 days before election day (by October 12). Voting is a right and responsibility of citizenship. Reach, through LOP, has helped many county residents become U.S. Naturalized Citizens and earn the right to vote.

Maryland is also hiring election judges. Apply <u>here</u>.
